Course Information A course designed to improve diver understanding of emergency situations in diving. The course covers self-rescue, diver stress, first aid equipment, diver tows, dealing with both a panicked and a passive victim, in-water artificial respiration, equipment removal and non-swimming assists among other subjects. The course includes classroom as well as pool exercises and open water evaluations. Students must have beginning and advanced scuba or equivalent, and be CPR certified. This course results in a PADI Rescue Diver certification or specialty rating. Students are required to supply their own SCUBA mask, and this will be covered during first class session. **Prerequisite: Advanced Open Water**

First Aid and CPR Certification As a requirement for PADI Rescue certification, you will need to be **current** in Emergency First Responder (EFR) or CPR and First Aid. ESDS will offer an EFR class for those who need it. The cost is \$65.00. This certification lasts for 2 years, includes materials and is instructed by a professional educator, unlike some “free” certifications. This class is paid for through the shop.

Rescue Weekend December 6th and 7th, Florence, OR Woahink Lake (West Boat Ramp)

You are responsible for your own transportation to and from the dive site for both days. ***You will also be responsible for picking up your own full set of scuba by the Friday before the weekend before 4:00 p.m. This gear will be returned on the following Monday before 4:00 p.m.***

We will meet in the West Woahink Parking Lot at Woahink at 8 a.m. on both days.

Gear Information: All the basic gear is provided except the following, which you are responsible to pick up and return if renting: Dive Knife and Whistle. Any non-metallic non-cork whistle will suffice. In addition a pocket mask is recommended (about \$15 and will last you for life) for the rescue weekend. This will be discussed in class.

You will need to stop by Eugene Skin Divers Supply to size up the equipment for the weekend outing. This needs to be done on a Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday before **week 8**. You will then drop by and pickup this gear for your weekend the Friday before your weekend. The gear must be returned on the following Monday.

Remember: LCC students will receive 20% off the purchase of Mask, Fins, Snorkel, Boots, and Gloves. You will also receive 15% off the purchase of Dive Lights and Knives. Having your own gear makes the class more enjoyable.
